In this exhibition artist Dora Budor has created new artworks. Her sculptures share hidden stories within architectural spaces that are often not seen.

She looks at:

Why a building or a feature is there, and why does it look like this?

The space around, or inside buildings, who and what is it for?

How the building and the spaces make things easier for you?

How the building and the spaces make things harder for you?

Word descriptions

Sculpture - to create a three-dimensional version of (something) using solid material.

Architectural – relating to the design and construction of building.

Feature - a special part of something.

Family Activity

Hidden Agenda

Explore Dora's exhibition and use the materials to experience being an artwork.

Think about how you might become a sculpture, a building, or a feature. A wide, small, short, flat, or tall artwork.

What is your purpose? How does that connect to the artwork or our building? Do you help people, or are you an obstruction?

1. Find a clear space in the gallery and climb into the tubular fabric to become your sculpture.
2. Pose, stay still, and become part of the gallery, try out different poses.
3. Repeat with the large fabric and your grown up. Cover yourselves to make another sculpture together.

Word descriptions


Purpose - why you do something or why something exists.

Obstruction - to block or get in the way of something or someone, or to prevent something from happening or by causing difficulties.
