#### **Mini Museum Collection**

Artist Claudia Martinez Garay is interested in highlighting the stories of museum artefacts and asks questions about where the objects came from and why are they in a museum?

#### She wants to find out:

- Why might it look like that?
- How was it used?
- What makes it special?
- Who did it belong to?
- What did it mean to them?
- What happened to it?



Explore the gallery. What do you notice? How does it make you feel?

# Activity 1 Object Handling

This activity explores museum objects through storytelling and object handling. It encourages handling objects and describing them using words and stories.

- 1. Find a clear space in our galleries to place the tray and take out the objects. Make sure you are clear of the artwork and visitors.
- 2. Take turns with the people you are with (friends and grown-ups) to handle the objects from the tray. Notice textures, patterns, marks and shapes.
- 3. In turn try to describe the object using the prompt words.
- 4. Use your imagination to create a story for the object.

Can you think of a word or symbol to sum up the stories and ideas you've shared. Draw or write it on to your object using the water pen. Watch what happens.

## Activity 2 Mini Museum

Imagine you are a curator! A curator is someone who puts together the collections of a museum, an exhibition, library, or similar.

- 1. Find a space in our galleries to place the tray. Make sure you are clear of the artwork and visitors. Build your own gallery using the tray and the card marked floor & walls.
- 2. Position the objects or/and the printed images inside the miniature gallery.
  - How do you decide the way objects are displayed?
  - Think about the story you gave to each object and how they might connect to each other.
- 3. Place the museum information card inside the mini museum. Share the stories about the objects using the information card as a prompt.
