Use the books: *What is Racism?* by Katie Daynes, Jordan Akpojaro, and *Standing Up to Racism* by Pragya Agarwal, Louise Forshaw, **to explore and discuss these topics.**

Key words

Stereotype: A belief about a person based on part of their identity. Stereotypes are usually negative and always harmful. They stop people being seen as individuals with all the rich layers that make up who they are.

Prejudice: An opinion that is formed without knowing or understanding all the facts.

- What are the different ways he makes art?

Donald wants you to see and think about the things you can't usually see, like the structures and workings underneath. He wants us to think about people, the world and how it all works. Using photographs from newspapers, and images from TV in his artworks he shows how some people are seen by society and are unfairly treated.

Key word - Collage: Both the technique and the work of art, in which pieces of paper, photographs, fabric and other materials are arranged (and stuck down) onto a supporting surface.
