Danica Maier Martin Scheuregger

Score: Mechanical Asynchronicity is a visual-musical performance by artist Danica Maier and composer Martin Scheuregger responding to the lace diagrams found in the Lace Archive held at Nottingham Trent University. The work brings together composers, artists, and musicians to experiment with disrupted repetition, the glitch and line.

The working process and presentation of *Score: Mechanical Aysnchronicity* sees visual artist Maier become 'composer' and composer Scheuregger become 'artist'. The ambiguity of authorship has featured in the collaborators' reflexive discussions, bringing into question the intentions of their working together.

The lace diagrams were translated into lines, then inscribed as punch-cards to be used with programmable music boxes. The musical results have been transcribed into traditional notation before further graphic renditions were created. This iterative, re-encoding process has resulted in a variety of pieces, each with differing levels of improvisation yet all stemming from the same source.

The work was created for flute, clarinet, violin and cello but can be played with any number and combination of instruments.

Danica Maier's practice uses site-specific installation, drawing and objects to explore expectations, with subtle slippages which transgress propriety. She is part of artists' group Returns, which explores post-industrial landscapes, manufacturing and craft skills. With Andrew Bracey she co-leads Bummock: Artists in Archives, investigating archives as catalysts for artworks. Maier is Associate Professor in Fine Art at Nottingham Trent University.

Martin Scheuregger received a PhD in Music from the University of York in 2015. He is a Lecturer in Music at the University of Lincoln and Artistic Director of contemporary music group Dark Inventions. In recent years Martin's music has been performed in the UK and internationally by CHROMA, Orkest de Ereprijs, Dark Inventions, Kreutzer Quartet, The 24, Richard Casey, Stef Conner, Chimera Ensemble, University of York Chamber Orchestra, and others.
