Nottingham Contemporary is delighted to launch CAMPUS, an independent study programme focussing on the exploration of modes of education and the collective production of knowledge. This autumn we welcome our first cohort of 20 CAMPUS participants who comprise individuals from a range of backgrounds and disciplines, ages and interest areas. We bring together artists, curators, historians, sociologists, solicitors, geographers, writers, tutors, performers and architects who successfully applied to this year's freeto-attend programme. CAMPUS meets monthly to engage in contemporary debates, critical thinking and cultural studies.

In addition to our study programme, CAMPUS opens the door to the public for regular free talks with visiting CAMPUS faculty members, featuring a comprehensive range of curatorial, artistic and critical voices. We aim to broaden the discussion beyond the seminar room and share with a wider audience questions about education, its role and legacies, as well as proposing and performing new models.
