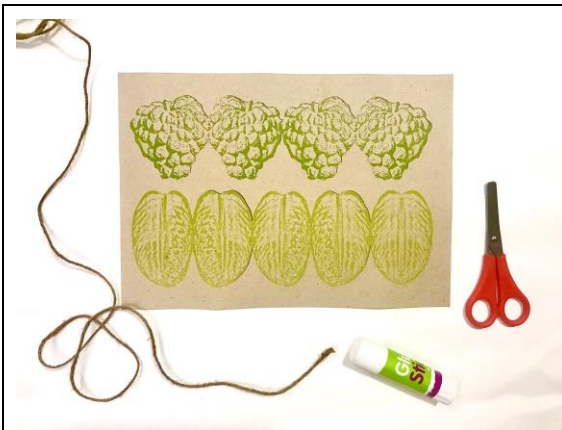
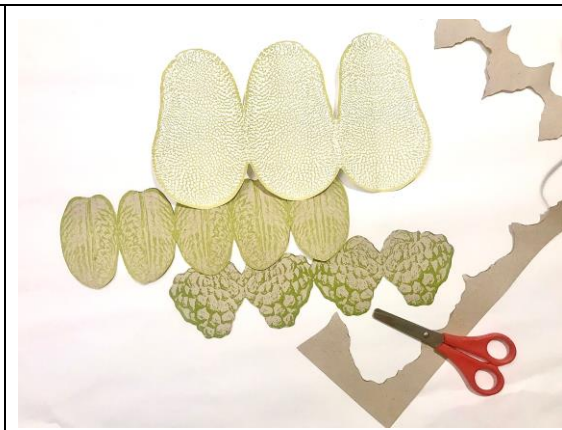


Activity: Fruit and Vegetable Chain



1. Find the printed sheets, a length of string and glue stick in your material pack. Or you can print the fruit and vegetable templates out on your preferred paper or thin card at home. You will also need a pair of scissors.



2. Cut around the printed images, carefully leaving them joined together at the sides.



3. Fold the fruits in the middle and edges. So it creates a zigzag shape when you look from the side, like a concertina.



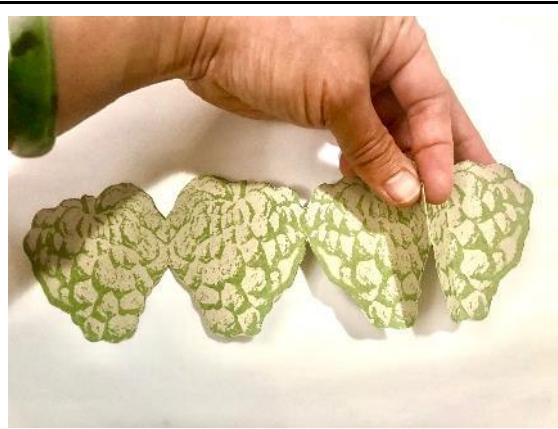
4. Glue the inside edges together and start to wrap around into a circle.



5. Before you glue the last two sides together, put the string through the middle.



6. Glue the final two sides together. Once it's dry, you can trim the edges.



7. Repeat the same process (2 - 5) to make up the other fruits using the same piece of string but above or below the previous fruit.
See what order you would put the fruits and vegetables in your chain.



8. Hang your fruit chain up when you finish it. You might also want to try to hold both sides of the string and spin it fast. Can you still see any patterns on your fruit chain?



9. Why not make your own plain fruit and vegetable shapes that you can colour, or print out in grey tone on natural paper to make stone looking pieces, or even try to texture the paper with a sharp pencil, hole puncher, stapler or paper clips.
